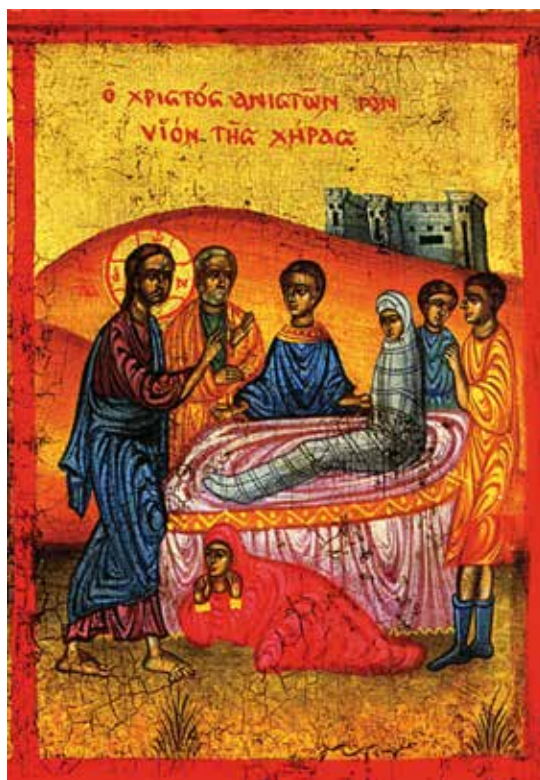

HOLY MARTYRS EULAMPIUS AND EULAMPIA (OCT. 10)

Saint Eulampius and his sister Saint Eulampia lived near a city called Nicomedia.¹ This city was located in the north western region of what is today Turkey.² They lived at the beginning of the fourth century.³ This was the time when the Roman Emperor Diocletian (284-305AD) while retaining leadership over the entire empire, divided the empire into four regions. Maximian and Constantius governed the western half and Galerius and Diocletian, the eastern half. ⁴ Diocletian further subdivided these regions into smaller territories and called them "Dioceses" (after his name). This name has been adopted in the Roman Catholic Church to denote the territory of a bishop.

Maximian was wary of the Christians and persecuted them relentlessly. He pressed Diocletian to eradicate them completely from the Empire. Diocletian then wrote four edicts which resulted in the execution of many thousands of Christians.⁵

At this time, many of the faithful fled Nicomedia and went into hiding. When Eulampius went into the city to buy bread, he saw the edict and tore it up. He was arrested and brought before a judge.⁶

The judge commanded him to deny Christ, but Eulampius responded that it was the judge who needed to deny the false idols and accept Christ as the one living God. For this he was flogged, and was placed on a hot bed of coals.⁷ Eulampius then asked if he could visit the pagan temple of Mars (the Roman god of war). Assuming that he was intending to worship the idol, he was brought before the pagan temple where he exclaimed, "In the Name of the Lord Jesus Christ I command you to fall to the floor and crumble into dust!" All at once the statue of Mars fell to the ground and was smashed to pieces, showing to all that idols are not gods at all. They are powerless before the God of heaven and earth. The people who saw this cried out, "The Supreme God is the Christian God, Who is great and mighty!"⁸ When St. Eulampius was taken away for more torture, his sister, Eulampia came before the judges and confessed that she too was a Christian. Seeing his sister, Eulampius said, "Sister, do not fear those who kill the body but are unable to kill the soul" (Mt.10:28).⁹

They were thrown into boiling pitch and then into a red-hot furnace. However, when they made the sign of the Cross and called upon the name of Christ the fire was not able to harm them. St. Eulampius was then taken out and beheaded, but St. Eulampia had died and was not beheaded. Some two hundred people had accepted the Christian Faith after seeing the power of God and miracles performed by Saints Eulampius and Eulampia. All of them were killed and were crowned with wreathes of martyrdom as they entered their heavenly home.¹⁰
