PRAY FOR THE SOULS IN PURGATORY

During our Liturgical year the Church has special days that dedicated to pray for the dead. Those days are dedicated to special prayers to God that the dead may have a share in Christ's victory over death. This is especially true for those who need purification after death – the Souls in Purgatory.

The dogma of the existence of Purgatory was proclaimed by the Church at the Council of Lyons in 1274. It was additionally confirmed by the Council of Trent (1545-1563) in a special decree. It is based on statements from the Holy Scriptures and the Church Tradition, which dates back to the second century.

St. Augustine made a great contribution to the development of the doctrine of Purgatory. The dogma emphasizes two truths: (1) the existence of Purgatory as a punishment for sins after death, where the soul has to purify itself before entering heaven, (2) and the possibility and necessity of our prayers and sacrifices for the Souls in Purgatory, as our help to the souls for a speedy purification before entering heaven.

Those souls who attained Purgatory after death are already safe. Why? Before death if a person repented from their sin, but did not have a chance to atone for their own sins, then Purgatory is the place to get purified before they get into heaven. So, Souls in Purgatory know they will eventually get to heaven, because they are in God's hands. They can be sure of salvation, but they still have to prepare for it. Purgatory is the vestibule of Heaven. It is a manifestation of God's mercy, which purifies those who have not been fully perfected in love of God, neighbor and self during their earthly life. The state of Purgatory should not be understood only as a punishment, but as a preparation for complete union with God in Heaven. For the dead to have a share in Christ's victory over death, they must be completely pure.

Through Purgatory pass those souls who have departed from this world in daily sins and have not atoned on earth a temporary punishment for sins. The essence of this punishment for sins is to temporarily be separated from God to be purified and to wait to meet Him. The human soul, which saw God as the fullness of love after death, wants to be united with Him, and at the same time acknowledges that it is not yet worthy of it and seeks the possibility of purification. God in His mercy responds to this desire with a reality we call Purgatory.

During this month of November, you can get a full or partial indulgence for the Souls in Purgatory or for the one you loved, who passed away. Conditions for receiving an indulgence are: visit the cemetery, receive Communion and pray for the intentions of the Holy Father, recite "Our Father", "Hail Mary" and "I believe... (known as Nicene Creed)", but most importantly you can offer Divine Liturgies for them, that is our work of mercy towards the church that is suffering. Indulgences are complete and partial. Upon receipt of full indulgence, all temporary punishment is forgiven. To receive complete forgiveness requires no attachment to any sin. This condition is important and means that the believer who wants to receive forgiveness, sincerely seeks to have nothing to do with sin, that is, you need to go to confession, and have to have a sincere intention to break away from sin. Let us sincerely help our sisters and brothers in Purgatory, offer and book Divine Liturgies for them, visit cemeteries, pray for them, and do the work of mercy for them.
