## THE HOLY AND GLORIOUS APOSTLE PHILIP - NOV. 14

Philip was one of the twelve Apostles called by Jesus. He was from Bethsaida, a fishing town off the northern shores of the Sea of Galilee. This was the same town that Saints Peter and Andrew were from, but they later moved to Capernaum a few kilometers west of Bethsaida.

When Jesus called Philip to follow Him, he began to evangelize immediately and went at once to Nathaniel (also known as Bar-tholomew) and brought him to Jesus saying, "We have found him of whom Moses in the Law and also the prophets wrote, Jesus of Nazareth, the son of Joseph."

When five thousand men gathered to hear Jesus speak, Jesus asked Philip how were they to buy bread for all the people. Jesus asked for something far beyond Philip's capability, because He wanted the apostles to learn to give in faith the little that they had, and trust that He would provide for the rest.

When Jesus entered Jerusalem on a donkey, a number of Greek speaking Gentiles from the Mediterranean world came for the Passover Feast. They were known as the "God-fearers". They were drawn to the ethics and morality of the Jews and were sympathetic to the Jewish faith, but were not circumcised. When they heard that Jesus had just raised Lazarus from the dead, they came to Philip and told him that they wanted to see Jesus. They were drawn to Philip because he was the only apostle with a Greek name suggesting that his parents were familiar with Greek and that he too knew Greek very well. Early on in the Acts of the Apostles these "God-fearers" became the first Gentile Christians.

It was also Philip that asked Jesus, "Lord, show us the Father". To which Jesus responded, "He who has seen me has seen the Father".

After Jesus's ascension, Philip went to Galilee, worked many miracles and brought many to Christ. In Greece he exposed the lie that the disciples had stolen Christ's body. Rather, it was the Pharisees that had bribed the soldiers to say this. The chief priests and their companions went to attack Philip, but were struck with blindness. Philip prayed for them and their sight was restored and many came to believe in Christ. He consecrated Narcissus to be their bishop and then traveled to Parthia, to the city of Azotus and healed a girl from blindness and then baptized her whole family.

He then went to Syrian Hieropolis and stayed at the house of Heros. The Pharisees wanted to kill the apostle, so they burnt down Heros's house. Philip healed the hand of the city official, restored a dead child back to life and when he performed many such miracles, the people repented and were baptized. He consecrated Heros to be their bishop before moving on to Syria, Asia Minor, Lydia, and Emessa.

Both Philip and Mariamne, his sister (her feastday - February 17) were hit with rocks, thrown into prison and cast out of villages. In the city of Phrygian Hieropolis, there were many pagan temples. In one temple, people worshiped a large snake god. Through Philip's prayers, the serpent died and many who were bitten by snakes, were healed. Amphipatos, the prefect of the city, found out that his wife had been healed and she had embraced the Christian faith. He ordered Philip and Bartholomew the apostle who had joined him, to be crucified. While on the cross, an earthquake struck and Philip prayed that the people's lives be spared. Seeing this, they took the apostles off their crosses. All lives were spared except for Amphipatos and the pagan priests. Philip did not survive the crucifixion but Bartholomew did and he baptized all those who came to believe. Mariamne buried her brother and went with Bartholomew to Armenia where he was later crucified.
