

ENTRANCE OF THE THEOTOKOS - NOVEMBER 21

It is from the proto-evangelion of St. James, written around 140 AD that we learn that the parents of Mary the Mother of God, were Joachim and Anna. In this account, we see that they were childless for most of their lives and the High Priest at that time told Joachim that his gifts offered in the Temple were not acceptable to God, because God had shown His displeasure with him by not giving them any offspring. Joachim and Anna prayed that God would grant them a child and vowed that if a child were born to them, they would dedicate it to the service of the Lord.

The Lord sent an angel first to Joachim who tells him that his good deeds were acceptable to God and that He had heard his prayers. Then he told him that his wife Anna will have a daughter and her name will be 'Mary'; and she will be consecrated to the Lord. Then the angel appeared to Anna and told her that Mary would remain in her father's house for three years. After she is weaned she will be brought to the Temple. There she will serve the Lord in prayer and fasting, until she will reach the age of discretion (perhaps12-14 years old). All this came to pass just as the angel had told them.1

When Mary reached the age of three, her parents decided to fulfill their vow. They dressed Mary in her finest clothes and together with their relatives and friends, went up to Jerusalem with lit lamps singing the sacred psalms. The virgins with her, escorted Her to the Temple singing, 2"In many colored robes. She is led to the king, with her virgin companions, her escort, in her train. With joy and gladness they are led along as they enter the palace of the king." (Psalm 45:14-15).3

The High Priest Zacharias was standing on top of the fifteen high steps that led to the sanctuary where only the High Priest was allowed to go. As the High Priest would ascend these fifteen steps, he would recite the fifteen "Psalms of Ascent", one Psalm for each step, starting with Psalm 120 and

ending with Psalm 134.4
By a special inspiration by God, Mary quickly went up the steps to the highest one. Then Zacharias, also through an inspiration from our Lord, led her into the Holy of Holies, where only the High Priest entered once a year. All who were present in the Temple were astonished at this most unusual occurrence.5

In the Old Testament, the Ark of the Covenant was a box made out of acacia wood, covered with gold. In it was kept three holy objects: the Ten Commandments, the staff of Aaron, and Manna bread that fell from heaven. Above the Arc, the Holy presence of God dwelt, in a pillar of fire by night and a cloud by day. Because of Israel's unfaithfulness, the Lord allowed the Babylonians to conquer them, and have them deposed to Babylon. The prophet Jeremiah took the Ark of the Covenant from the Holy of Holies and buried it in a cave on Mt. Nebo.6 Later when King Cyrus let the Israelites go back to their land, they rebuilt the destroyed Temple, but it had no Ark of the Covenant.

The angel Gabriel told the prophet Daniel that 490 years will have to pass for the Israelites to atone for their iniquity. Then the Messiah will arrive. Mary is known as the fulfillment of the Ark of the Covenant. She is the one who will carry Jesus in her womb. So in this feast, it is fitting that she should enter first as the living Ark of the Covenant, anticipating the entrance of Gods Holy Presence, her Son, returning to the Temple.
